

BC Cancer Screening Up-to-date Information on CareConnect Working Group Terms of Reference

Background

- Cancer screening test results are available on CareConnect, however, finding them and assessing each to determine when a patient may next be due to screen can be time consuming
- A summary tab on CareConnect is proposed that could utilize BC Cancer Screening Program's data on whether the programs (breast, cervix, colon, lung) understand a patient to be up-to-date with screening or when they may be due

Purpose

1. Based on data available to the Screening Programs, determine what content, descriptions and labels should be used in the summary tab to help convey screening up-to-date information with providers
2. Obtain recommendations from primary care providers on how to communicate to providers when this new resource becomes available

Scope of Responsibilities

- Advise on the structure of the table and the wording to be used to best convey cancer screening up-to-date summary information on CareConnect
- Review mock-up of "Cancer Screening Program Tab" for CareConnect and ensure usability of content
- Support the development of provider education materials for using the viewable table on CareConnect
- Review communication plan for communicating to providers when this content becomes available on CareConnect

Out-of-Scope of Responsibilities

- Review technical elements and development of viewable table on CareConnect
- Document other or opportunistic cancer screenings outside of the four BC Cancer Screening Programs (breast, cervix, colon, lung) in the "Cancer Screening Program Tab"

- Including in-progress activities such as referrals or work in progress in the “Cancer Screening Program Tab”
- Review other components of CareConnect, such as general limitations of CareConnect
